EXPLAINING THE MBA FORTIFICATION SYSTEM

DR. C HOLDS CLASS IN SQUARE LA 28P

Several of us returned to the hotel earlier than the others for one of our special final pottery reading sessions (several to go; we've got a lot!). We read the tomb pottery and the dolmen pottery over about a three hour period, and what interesting results! Tomb 55 had mostly MB2 (time of Abraham) pottery, with a few LB2a forms (time of Moses and Joshua). That

fits nicely with Tall el-Hammam being Sodom, and with it also being Abel Shittim where Moses and the Israelites camped for a good bit of time before crossing the Jordan over to Jericho and Gilgal. Remember, the Israelites buried the last of their rebellious wilderness wanderers while encamped on the Plains of Moab (the same area occupied by the Cities of the Kikkar). Perhaps they buried one of them in our Tomb 55 with a few funerary vessels, including a lamp. All interesting to consider!

The pottery reading results from the dolmen were really amazing. It contained vessels from the Chalcolithic Period, EB1, EB2, EB3, and IB. This will be a tremendous addition to our knowledge and interpretation of dolmens, and will, I think, make quite a splash when we publish it later this year.
