Mercy Ships reaches these vulnerable children and families and provide the hope and healing they have been praying for.

Mercy Ships' hospital ships are filled with state—of—the—art medical equipment and a volunteer crew of doctors, nurses, medical staff, technicians, teachers, physical therapists and other caring people driven by mercy to help make the world a better, healthier place for all.
